WHEREAS, a status conference was held on June 18, 2004 at which the Court discussed matters relating to the pleadings and discovery with counsel:

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. Pleadings

a. By August 15, 2004, counsel are to resolve by dismissal or consolidation the remaining multiple lawsuits filed on behalf of the same individual plaintiffs. Plaintiffs' counsel will ensure that the Amended Complaint incorporating all defendants and claims or the order consolidating the multiple claims shall be filed in the first filed suit. The plaintiffs' time to serve the aforementioned Amended Complaints is extended until August 31, 2004. The foregoing does not waive any of defendants' affirmative defenses, including statute of limitations defenses.

b. Plaintiffs have amended their Individual Complaints to remove certain defendant non-carrier airlines and security equipment manufacturers. Plaintiffs shall timely execute Rule 41 dismissals prepared by these defendants.

c. Defendants who wish to amend their Notices of Adoption may do so without leave of the Court until September 1, 2004.

2. Discovery

a. Further to this Court's Order of June 18, 2004, American Airlines, Inc. and United Airlines, Inc. have met and conferred with plaintiffs to resolve their objections to Plaintiffs' Master Discovery Requests (First Set).

b. Argenbright Security, Inc., Huntleigh USA Corporation and Globe Aviation Services Corp. will meet and confer with plaintiffs to resolve their objections to Plaintiffs' Master Discovery Requests (First Set) by August 1, 2004.

c. Within thirty (30) days after the meet and confer meetings American Airlines, Inc., United Airlines, Inc., Argenbright Security, Inc., Huntleigh USA Corporation and Globe Aviation Service Corp. will produce documents to which no outstanding objections remain and which do not contain potential Sensitive Security Information ("SSI") to plaintiffs. These defendants also will forward potential SSI documents to which no outstanding objection remains to the Transportation Security Administration within thirty (30) days of the meet and confer meetings.


d. To the extent the foregoing parties are unable to resolve any discovery disputes at the meet and confer meetings, the parties should submit a joint letter describing their dispute in accordance with Rule 2(e) of my individual rules prior to filing discovery motions.

3. Status Conference

a. The next status conference will be held on September 24, 2004 at 11:00 a.m.
